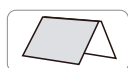
Rock the model back and forth and he stretches out his neck in a charming way.

Make two and they will kiss!

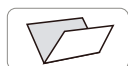
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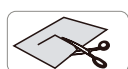
Assembly Instructions



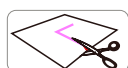
----- Mountain fold
● Make a mountain fold.



- - - - - Valley fold
● Make a valley fold.



— Scissors line
● Cut along the line.



— Cut in line
● Make a cut.



A1 Glue spot
● Glue parts with the same number together.

Tools and Materials



Scissors, set square, glue (such as woodwork glue), metal rod, spatula, a used pen, toothpicks, tweezers (useful for handling small parts).

Assembly Tip



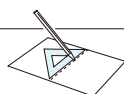
Before gluing, crease the paper along mountain fold and valley fold lines and make sure rounded sections are nice and stiff.

Caution



This craft requires the use of glue, scissors, tweezers, and other tools which may be dangerous to young children. Please keep them out of reach of children while you work.

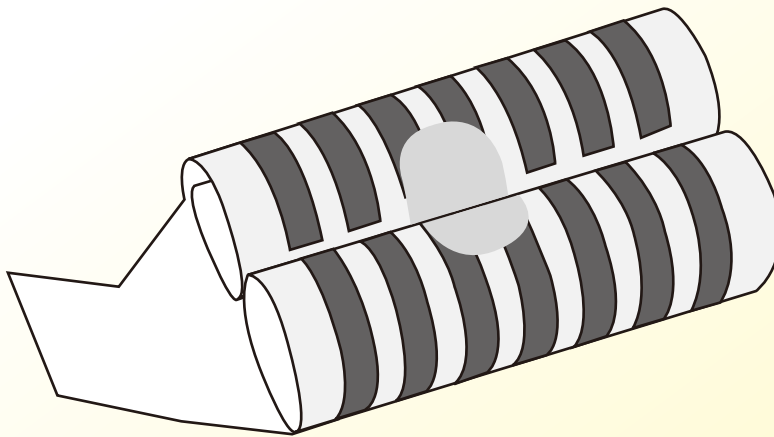
Handy Hints



Trace along the folds with a used pen (no-ink) to get a sharp, easier fold.

- Before assembling: Each part has glue tabs and areas to attach the glue tabs to marked on both sides. Glue the front sides and back sides together firmly using spray adhesive. When doing so, take care not to attach the parts upside down. We recommend using thick matte photo paper for the front sides, and regular thin paper for the back sides.

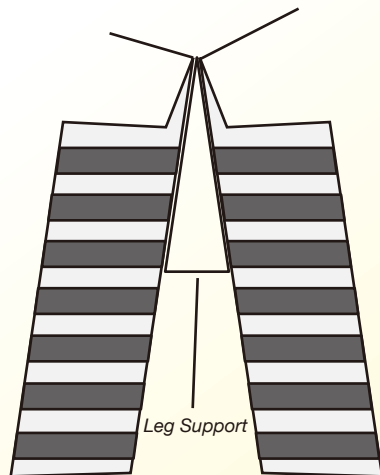


Roll round the Legs and glue them into place (1-2)

Glue the two Legs together. (3)

Repeat the process with the other set of Legs. (4-6)

Assemble the Leg Support (7)

Glue the Legs to the Leg Support. (8-9)

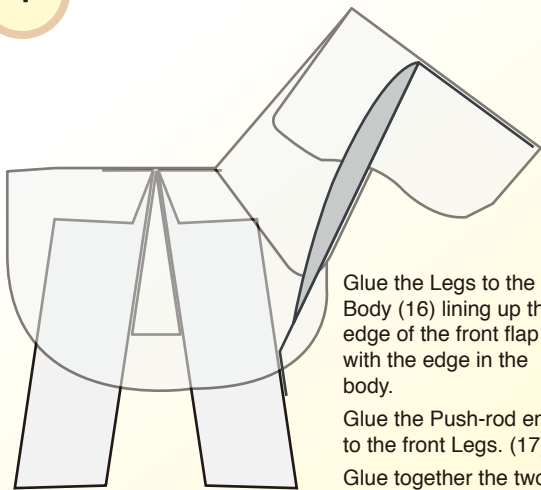

Glue together the Head. (10)
Glue together the Body (11)
Glue the Neck to the Body (12-13)
Glue the Head Pushrod into place in the Head (14) The end of the long tab should be lined up with the front of the nose. It is easier to see how it fits into place in the diagram in the next box.
Glue the Body Back into place with the two grey semicircles at the top. (15)

Glue the Legs to the Body (16) lining up the edge of the front flap with the edge in the body.
Glue the Push-rod end to the front Legs. (17)
Glue together the two Tail halves (18) and glue it into place. (19)
Glue on the Ears (20-21)



Once the glue is dry your Zebra is ready to play!
Make two and they will kiss!
